



Principal's Report

NAPLAN

Year 7 and 9 students will be involved in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on Tuesday 9 May, Wednesday 10 May and Thursday 11 May, 2017. Each test will take between 40 and 65 minutes to complete. There are three Literacy and two Numeracy tests, spread over three days with rest breaks between tests on the same day.

Students will need to bring a HB or 2B pencil, an eraser and a pencil sharpener to all tests. Mechanical lead pencils are not permitted. A blue or black pen is recommended for use on the writing test on May 9. Students are expected to have a working calculator with them for the first Numeracy test on Thursday May 11. Multifunction or internet accessible devices are not permitted.

Later in the year, you will receive a NAPLAN report describing your child's particular skills in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. The report will also show how your child performed in relation to national benchmark standards. These benchmarks describe minimum acceptable standards for students across Australia.

Interim Reports

Interim Reports will be available on Compass on Thursday 16 March to give you an update on your child's progress and to help form your discussion with your child's teacher at Learning Conferences. These should be used as a guide as to the positive learning habits your child has developed or areas in which they can focus on for improvement.

Student Learning Conferences and Interim reports

Student learning conferences are coming up on Thursday 23 March, from 12:00pm to 8:00pm. Learning conferences are an opportunity for a three-way conversation between parents, students and teachers. Students should reflect on their efforts and discuss future learning goals and challenges with their parents and teachers. As active participants in their own education, students are expected to attend the learning conferences with you.

Bookings for individual learning conference appointments have now opened via Compass and will close at 4:30pm on Wednesday 22 March. The maps of the college found within this newsletter will help you in planning your learning conference appointments. To optimise your learning conferences it can be helpful to leave a break between appointments with teachers. 2017 Avalon International Airshow

On Friday 3 March, a group of 10 students from the 2016 aviation class and I were very lucky to be invited to the opening of the 2017 Avalon Airshow where students participated in a careers day. The focus was careers in the aviation sector (not just pilot training) and demonstrated to students the best ways to build careers in engineering, avionics and air traffic systems (just to name a few of the unlimited options).

After the presentation, we were treated to a wide range of aerial displays, both civilian and military jets including the A320, B737 (pictured) and various fighters including the FA-18 Super Hornet. It was certainly a great day out and allowed students to sit in a wide range of aircraft, speak to the pilots and engineers and visit hundreds of static displays and information sites.



The Airshow runs every two years, and students from the 2017/18 class will be invited the next time the airshow is open in 2019.

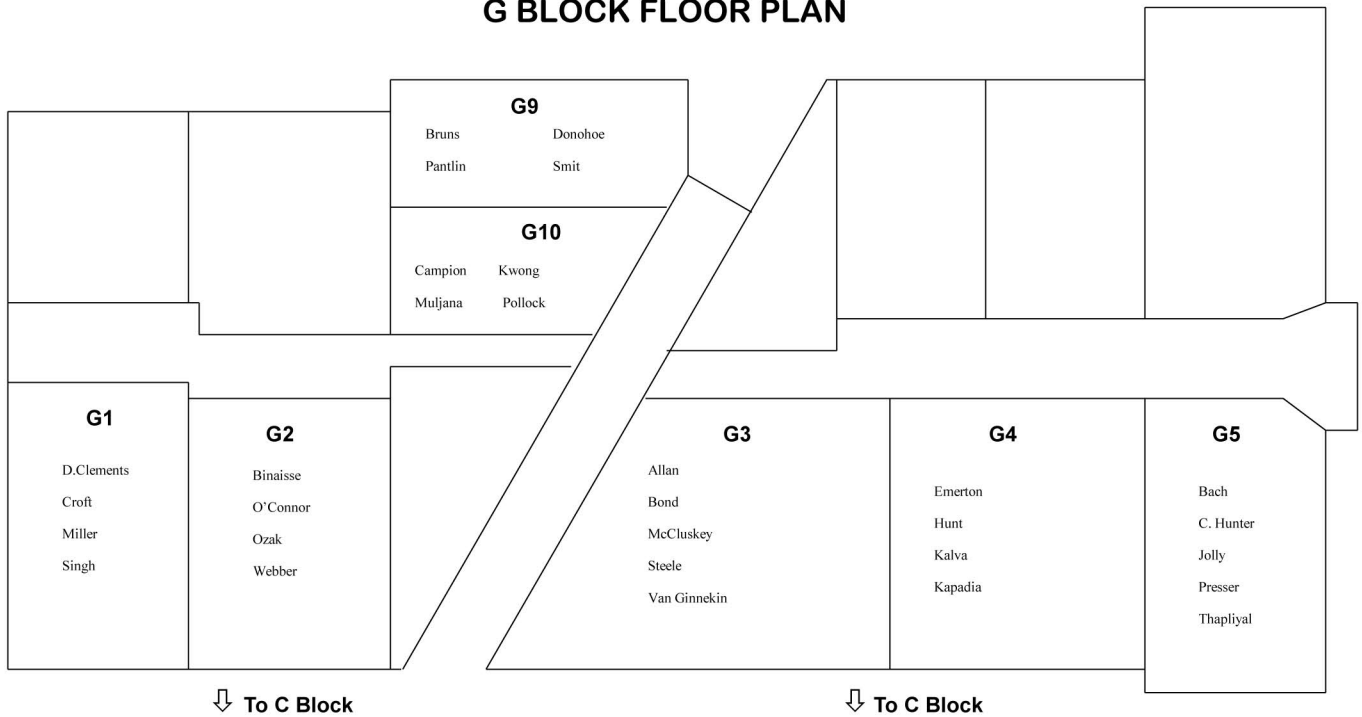

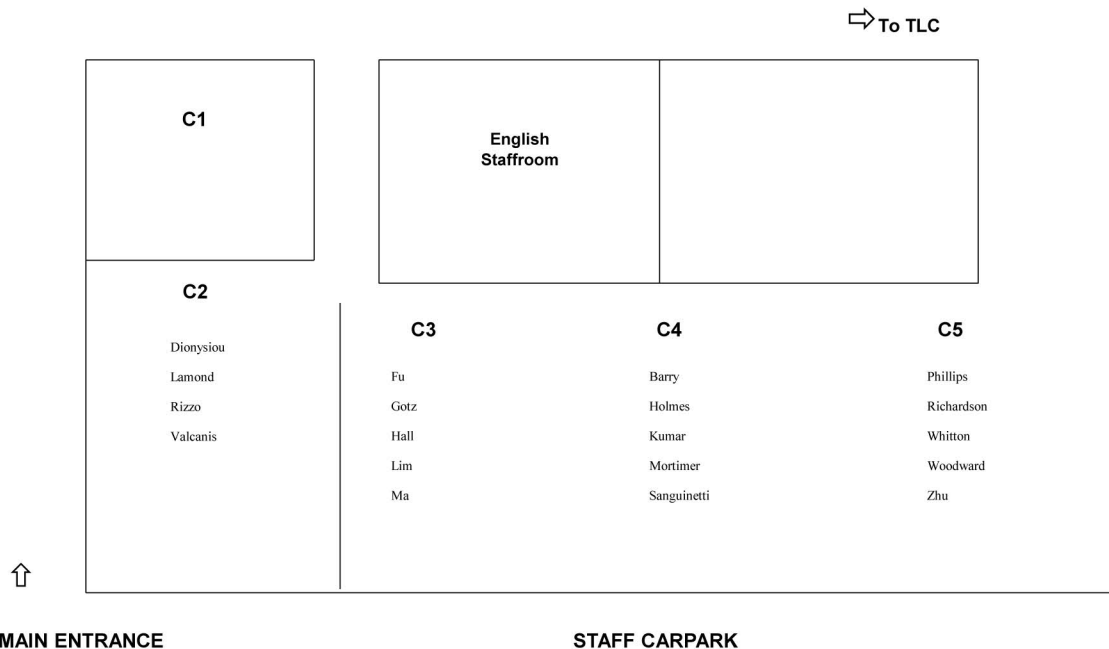

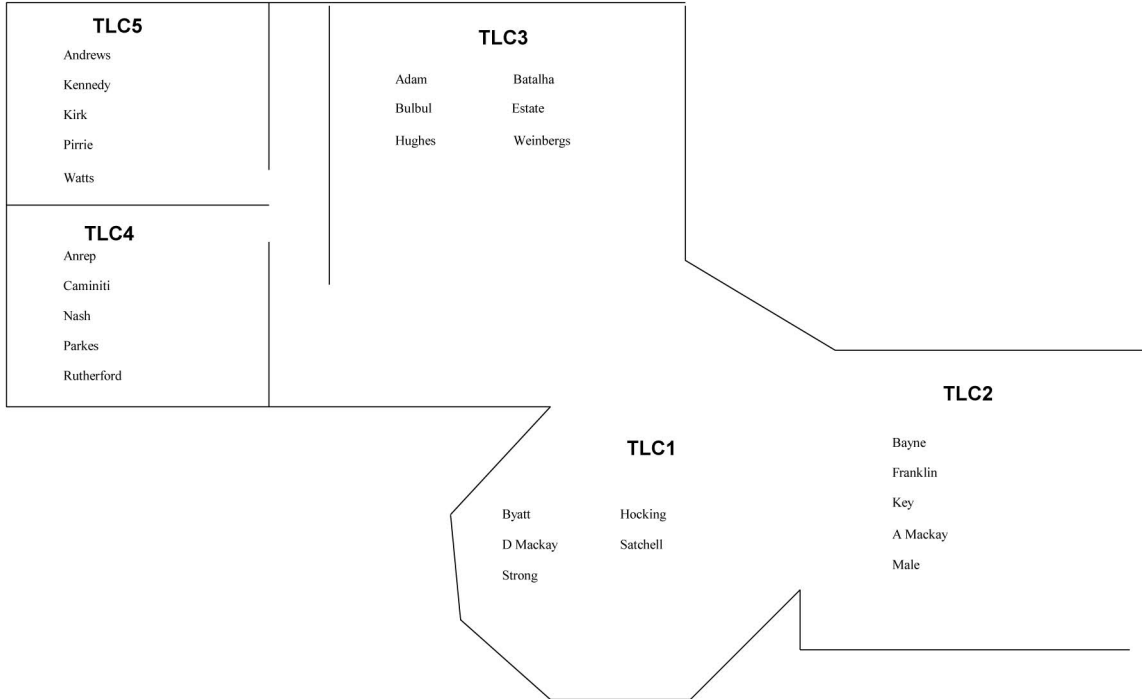

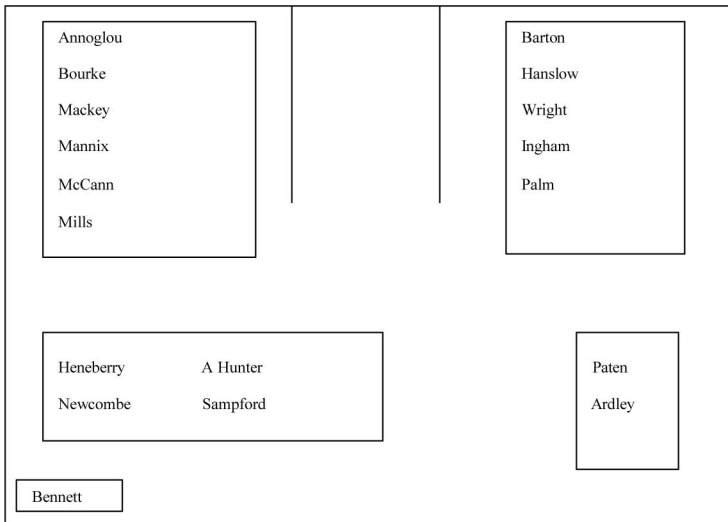

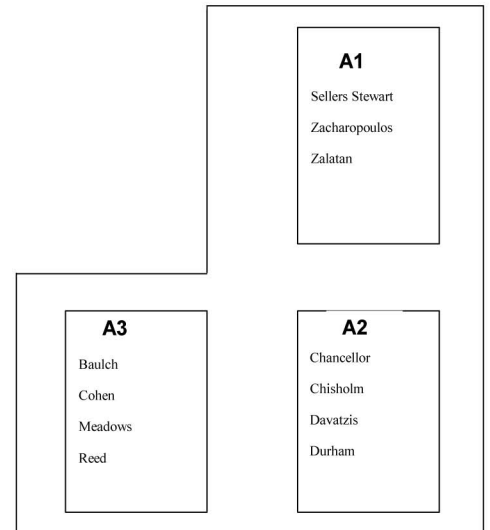
TLC CENTRE FLOOR PLAN
